

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

2017 Cheviot Spring Festival

Public - Hosted by Cheviot NZ and Cheviot Spring Festival





Easter Monday, April 17, and over 100 Mustangs converged on the display grounds at Canterbury Agricultural Park as CMOC's event to recognise Mustang's birthday, as part of the worldwide celebrations that day.

After last year's inaugural event (over 200 Mustangs at McLeans Island when the 17th fell on a Sunday, and not a holiday), Easter Monday was always going to be the challenge. We decided to try a different approach, and hold the display in Christchurch, and test whether we could navigate all the rules and requirements that the CCC require to use one of their reserves as a venue. It worked (!), and the combination of the lush green grass, the oak trees still in leaf, and the pavilion building and veranda gave the venue a distinct park like feeling which many commented on.

Why is April 17 important? It is widely and enthusiastically acknowledged by Mustang owners and clubs, Ford, and the wider auto industry as the day the Mustang legend was born. The Mustang launch itself in 1964 was very different to today's new model introductions. There had been just enough hype and build up (especially the New York Motor Show) to tell everyone know something special was coming from Ford, but all cars were kept out hidden until the weekend of April 17, when "wall to wall" national advertising announced that the Mustang was on show in every Ford dealership. Dealers experi-

enced showroom crowds never seen before, and 22000 orders were taken on the first day and kept building in the days following. The initial dealer stock of approx. 20000 was quickly sold out many times over. The legend was born, and auto history still rates it as one of the best new car introductions ever.

Back to April 17, CMOC and Christchurch. It was great to meet new members for whom this was their first event, and some new cars most of us had not seen before....a new 2017 Shelby GT350 LHD, and a gorgeous original '69 Shelby GT500 were two that caught the eye.

Next year? We're not sure yet what format our event will take. Being a week day (the 17th is a Tuesday, two weeks after Easter), it will require some innovative planning! But I'm sure we'll find a way to make it special and involving for as many members as possible.

Now if only I could ditch the work






MEMBER PROFILE




(I guess this would have been a conversation topic when the "Originals" formed the CMOC)



There were two identical cars used in the movie, this one that did all the dirty work and a second car which was kept intact for close up shots. The second car has been sold several times and is in the hands of a private collector.

Well, good news folks the actual car driven by Steve McQueen has been found after being abandoned for decades. It was laying in a back yard in the Baja California peninsula of Mexico. The car was a shell, but was the correct chassis number and still had the reinforced suspension towers, the custom 9 inch rear diff and holes in the boot used to mount a generator to run the in-car lights.

The car is now being restored for the movie's upcoming 50th anniversary.





2015-2017 Mustang Sales:

By April this year, Ford had built 395,000 of the new Mustang with 98,000 of these shipped to customers outside the USA. Ford expects exports of new Mustangs to reach 30% for this year. It is now available in 140 countries across all continents except Antarctica. Mustang was the best-selling sports car in the world in 2016.

The natural competitors to the Mustang, the Chevrolet Camaro and Dodge Challenger each have sold about half the number of the Mustang. Mustang is the most-liked vehicle on Facebook with more than 8.4 million likes

2018 Mustang:

In Sept/Oct this year a revamped Mustang will be launched with a new front and rear design and advanced technologies including a 12 inch all digital instrument panel, a 10-speed transmission, automatic MagneRide damping system and an active valve performance exhaust. It will be available in additional countries including Brazil, the Palau Islands and the Ivory Coast. Can't wait!

Cosworth V8 for Mach 1

Cosworth, the engine manufacturer, has just announced plans to build a \$30 million plant in suburban Detroit. The location was chosen as it is close to it's customer base. That's pretty close to Ford's Dearborn plant.



TVR will be using a version of the Mustang Coyote V8 tuned by Cosworth in their upcoming rebirth. This would be a perfect motor for Ford to use in the 2018 Mach 1.


