

'Hi Keith'


....and that was The End, believe me!

News briefs

- Shelby Electric. Carroll Shelby, famous for the Cobra, Mustang GT and GT40 in the '60s, is to build the fastest-ever electric car. It will be called the Shelby Supercar (SSC) and will be launched in about three months in the United States at SSC's Washington State-based operation. Details of the plan are scare, but SSC says the car will reach 100km/h in 2.5 secs, and go on to a top speed of 330km/h, with a 250-350km range on a single charge. SSC says the electric powertrain can be configured for outputs from 150 900kW, and says it wants to wholesale the system to mass production car companies.
- Ford Falcon is 2008 New Zealand Car of the Year. The new FG Ford Falcon has been judged NZ's Car of the Year by the country's leading motoring writers and broadcasters. The FG Falcon, launched in June 08, is the first iteration of the Falcon family to have won NZs top automotive accolade.
- Ford FPV F6 is the NZ Autocar Magazine Car of the Year. The FPV F6 has taken top honours at the 2008 AMI Insurance NZ Autocar Car of the Year Awards. Chief judge Paul Owen said the FPV F6 was a clear winner. The award pits 10 category winners against each other, and for a performance car to win overall it must score highly for its practicality and value. Mr Owen said the 20-point margin of the FPV's win was unprecedented in the 15-year history of the magazine's Car of the Year award.
- **F150 A Bestseller.** The Ford F-Series truck is best selling vehicle in America, and has been so for the past 27 consecutive years; and it has also been the best-selling truck for 32 consecutive years.

45th Anniversary

March 2009 -Phoenix, Arizona:

A year ago when organizers began preparations for the 2009 Mustangs Across America road trip, it was never dreamed that over 600 cars would be a part of the event. It was never dreamed that nearly 100 participants would be coming from countries around the world including



Australia, Canada, Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Mexico, New Zealand, Slovakia, South Africa, Sweden, The Netherlands, and the UK. But despite the economic turmoil and record gasoline prices in the past 12 months, excitement for the Mustang's 45th Birthday is higher than ever. Mustang enthusiasts have signed up in record breaking numbers to participate in the 2009 Mustangs Across America 45th Anniversary drive. Over 600 Mustangs are registered to date, and entries continue to come in daily. The epic Mustang road trip is headed from Shelby Automobiles in Las Vegas, NV on Saturday April 11th to arrive in Birmingham, AL on April 15th to attend Mustang Club of America's big Mustang 45th Anniversary Bash. The five-day road trip



adventure winds its way across America's heartland, stopping for several local events. The route includes parts of Route 66, Interstate 40 and Interstate 20 in the South. The driving days average about 400 miles and include a complete itinerary of stops and breaks for travelers.

The History of Henry...

An outline history of Ford Mustang development over the years. Part Four: The start of the fourth generation - 1994 - 1903

1994 Mustang:

Not only did 1994 mark the 30th anniversary of the Ford Mustang; it also ushered in the fourth generation of the car. The '94 Mustang was built on a new SN-95 Platform. Of the vehicle's 1,850 parts, Ford reported that 1,330 had changed. The new Mustang looked different, and it drove differently as well. Structurally, it was engineered to be stiffer. Ford offered two engine options, the 3.8L V-6 engine and the 5.0L V-8 engine. Later in the year Ford released the redesigned SVT Mustang Cobra, which sported a 5.0L V-8 engine capable of generating 240 hp. The vehicle was featured as the official Indianapolis 500 pace car for the third time in history.

Coupe and convertible models continued to be available options, while the hatchback body style was dropped from the Mustang lineup.

1995 Mustang:

This was the last year Ford used the 5.0L V-8 in the Mustang. In future models, Ford incorporated a 4.6L engine. In 1995, Ford released a stripped down version of the GT Mustang, named the GTS. It featured all the performance parts of the GT without the flashy styling accessories such as fog lights, leather seating, and power doors and windows.

1996 Mustang:

For the first time in history, Mustang GTs and Cobras were equipped with a 4.6L modular V-8 engine instead of the long used 5.0L V-8. The Cobra version featured a 4.6L dual-overhead cam (DOHC) aluminum V-8, which produced approximately 305 hp. The GTS Mustang remained in the lineup, although the model name changed from GTS to 248A.

1997 Mustang:

In 1997, Ford's Passive Anti-Theft System (PATS) became a standard feature on all Mustangs. The system was designed to protect against drive away theft through the use of an electronically coded ignition key.

1998 Mustang:

Although there were very few changes to the Mustang in 1998, the GT version received a power upgrade as the 4.6L V-8 engine increased to 225 hp. Ford also offered a 'Sports' package in '98, featuring black racing stripes. This was the last year for the round-body Mustang. Although the SN-95 Platform would continue to be used, the overall body style of the Mustang would change the following year.

... Mustangs through the years



1999 Mustang:

Many people mistake the 1999 model lineup as the launch of a new generation Mustang. Although the body style changed significantly, the Mustang was still based on the SN-95 Platform. The redesigned Mustang, which coincided with the 35th anniversary of the Mustang, featured sharp design lines and an aggressive stance in addition to a new grille, hood, and lamps. Both engines received power upgrades. The 3.8L V-6 increased in horsepower to 190 hp, while the 4.6L DOHC V-8 was capable of producing 320 hp.

2000 Mustang:

In 2000, Ford released the third version of the SVT Mustang Cobra R. In all, only 300 units were produced. This street legal Mustang featured a 385 hp, 5.4L DOHC V-8 engine. It was also the first Mustang to ever feature a six-speed manual transmission.

2001 Mustang:

Ford released the special-edition Mustang Bullitt GT in 2001. The car was based on the 1968 Mustang GT-390 driven by Steve McQueen in the movie "Bullitt". In all, an estimated 6,500 units were produced. Enthusiasts placed their orders for this vehicle long before they became available to dealerships. Those who waited until the model-year launch had a difficult time locating the Bullitt GT.



The vehicle was only offered in Dark Highland Green. It featured a lowered suspension, a

brushed-aluminum gas cap, and a "Bullitt" badge on the rear panel.

2002 Mustang:

There was no doubting it; the rising popularity of SUVs had resulted in fewer sales of American sports cars. In 2002, the Chevrolet Camaro and Pontiac Firebird both ended production of their sports cars. The Ford Mustang was the sole survivor.

2003 Mustang:

The Mustang Mach 1 returned to the Mustang lineup in 2003. It featured a ram-air "Shaker" hood scoop and a V-8 engine capable of producing 305 hp.

Meanwhile, Ford released a SVT Mustang Cobra that featured an Eaton supercharger for its 4.6L V-8 engine. Horsepower was upped to 390, which resulted in the fastest production Mustang at that time. Many enthusiasts note that Ford's Cobra horsepower figure is inaccurate. It's been widely reported that many stock Cobras were capable of outputting





Club Night Visit

VISIT TO CWF HAMILTONS

Around 20 members met up at CWF Hamilton's in Lunns Road. Mike Neville and Richard Scott, both long time employees, greeted us and ushered us into the committee room to kick the night off with a



couple of videos. The first clip showed founder Bill Hamilton at Irishman's Creek Station, where the first jet unit was designed built and tested, also on the clip was footage of the Hamilton Crane, and early earthmoving equipment pioneered by Hamilton's. The second clip showed how the company had progressed and how the company has become known throughout the world. We then split up into two groups for a tour of the factory which was operating as they are at present working 24 hours a day 5 days a week. The machinery being operated within the factory are in the main fully automated and worth in the vicinity of between 1.5 to 2 million dollars each, the tooling on each machine costs on average of between \$800 to \$1200 each, all tooling is supplied by Sandvik, who have two reps with their own office on site. Some statistics to ponder on:-

- One machine has 46 tools on it with an average cost of between \$800 to \$1200 each.
- The largest jet unit the HT1000 can pump 10,000 litres of water per second.
- The company is still family owned.
- All castings both aluminium and stainless are done by the company.
- Hamilton's have a customs clearing facility for overseas orders on site. At present they are filling an order for the Indian Government, where two HT1000 units and two mid sized units are fitted on one vessel, and if you were able to back it into the QE11 pool it would empty the pool in under 15 seconds.

The evening was wrapped up after a tour lasting an hour and a half with a round of applause from our members for Mike and Richard, and a bottle of vino for each of them by way of thanks.


