
Our construction industry is losing nearly one person every week to suicide. 98% of those we lose are our men.

Who will be attracted to the 2024 Mustang?

The debut of the 2024 Ford Mustang is a notable one for a number of reasons, particularly since the beloved pony car can still be had with V8 power and a manual transmission – two things that are slowly going away in the automotive world, even as most have opted for an automatic thus far – though the S650 generation Mustang is designed to appeal to younger customers with its fancy new gadgets and big screens inside the cabin. However, the 2024 Ford Mustang is suddenly without a proper rival given the impending discontinuation of the sixthgeneration Camaro and its uncertain future past this year, as well as the end of Dodge Challenger production – though those models may live on, after all – even if it is in all-electric form. Regardless, it doesn't seem as if Ford expects the Bow Tie and Mopar faithful to switch to The Blue Oval side, as Ford Mustang brand manager Jim Owens recently explained to *CarExpert*.

"This isn't our first time that Camaro and Challenger haven't been with us," Owens said. "There's been times where they've not been here in the segment, and we've been there continuously. First in, last out. We'll still be there. For the people who have a Bow Tie tattooed on their body, or a Challenger Hellcat, Redeye, Demon... we probably won't bring those people in. For those who are still interested in an internal-combustion engine version of the sports car and don't have their loyalties, we really believe we have not only the design, but the powertrain and the suspension, and that technology [to win them over]." Given the strong brand loyalty that fans of the Mustang, Camaro, and Challenger typically exhibit, these comments don't come as much of a surprise. However, those that find themselves wanting a traditional, V8-powered, manual transmission-equipped, rear-wheel drive American performance car may soon cave, given the fact that only one will seemingly be available moving forward.



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


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2024 Mustang interior designed to attract younger buyers?????

The all-new 2024 Ford Mustang debuted last September, sporting quite a few changes, along with a few welcome carry-over features, such as a fortified version of the naturally-aspirated Ford 5.0L V8 Coyote engine – which the automaker plans to continue to offer as long as possible – though it did ditch the manual transmission option in the EcoBoost due to low demand. With production ramping up and deliveries imminent, the pony car faithful will soon get to experience all of these changes first-hand, which include a heavily-revised interior designed to attract young buyers, as Jim Owens, head of marketing for the Mustang, recently explained to *CarExpert*. "When you get to play with that stuff, it's going to bring in a younger audience for sure," Owens said. "The focus group stuff that we did; younger audience es said 'hey it's about time' and 'oh this is cool,' They like to personalize their technology, it's how they grew up – and they loved it."

Interestingly, 2024 Ford Mustang buyers have a choice between two screen layouts – a base setup that uses two screens as separate units, along with an optional layout that provides more of a seamless look, courtesy of a single piece of integrated glass that covers both screens and is angled toward the driver. Either way, both screens offer drivers essentially the same features. The instrument cluster, for example, can be customized to display different animated designs and new drive-mode dependent visuals, with a copper appearance theme and different graphics based on what drive mode is selected. Both screens are fully customizable and drivers can make changes with simple swipes, while both utilize the same Unreal Engine 3D creation tool used in modern video games like *Fortnite*, presenting real-time graphical renderings, along with the ability to change ambient interior lighting settings.



Ford Performance Head frustrated with V8 Supercars situation

Ford has certainly faced its fair share of challenges in the current season of Australia's V8 Supercars series, with its Ford Mustang racers slated to get a revised engine setup designed to eliminate rear tire lift and improve drivability, as well as a revised aero package that hasn't exactly been a hit with the teams campaigning those cars. Ford Performance global head Mark Rushbrook previously expressed his desire for more transparency in this particular series – and now, he's admitted that he's displeased with the amount of time that it has taken organizers to level the proverbial playing field, according to *Drive*.



"Am I frustrated with Supercars? Yes," Rushbrook said. "Do we evaluate our future in Supercars? We evaluate our future in every series on a very regular basis and we look for the ability to win races and championships. Any decision for any series, whether to join or to leave, is a difficult decision because we don't want to be coming and going in different series. What I will say about Supercars is...I said I am frustrated. But they are starting to make the changes. I wish they would've done it before the season started, but they are making changes now to try and improve the situation. Supercars have certainly recognized...they need to update their processes and they are active."

"So its the visual and what they can hear, they put out a great sound."








Gull Service Station photo shoot 23 August

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
Run to Good Home Pegasus 13th September
