
The run started at The West Melton Community Centre and went via Hororata and the scenic drive to Oxford, a run of about 1 hour.

low me to take off. So it was back to my hand held camera!!


As well as pictures of our club members Mustangs, I have included a selection of the "other" brands" that took my eye. There are certainly some enthusiasts out there.

2026 Shelby Super Snake-R Debuts as Latest Supercharged S650 Mustang

The Ford Mustang Dark Horse is a killer in its own right, packing the legendary 5.0L Coyote V8 to the tune of 500 horsepower in harness under the hood. Naturally, Shelby American couldn't keep its hands off the go-fast pony, officially revealing the 2026 Shelby Super Snake-R as the latest rendition of the supercharged S650 Mustang.

The limited-edition build is based on the S650 Mustang Dark Horse. packing a number of upgrades that it in league with highput performance sports cars. Shelby saw fit to slap a supercharger on the Dark Horse's already mean 5.0L V8, coaxing upwards of 850 horsepower from that howling Coyote. All that power is routed to the rear two wheels (RWD) via either the Tremec TR-3160 six-speed manual transmission, or the 10-speed automatic transmission.

Though the horsepower is the star of the show, the 2026 Shelby Super Snake-R packs a fully adjustable coil over suspension system. It's been given a wider stance, too, helping to keep it planted at any speed, along with special bodywork and a Shelbyspec chassis stiffening system. Designers opted for extensive carbon fiber and lightweight aluminum components, keeping the pony car light on its feet despite its extra equipment. In fact, the tuner states that the 2026 Shelby Super Snake-R is just 116 pounds heavier than the stock S650 Mustang Dark Horse.

"The 2026 Shelby Super Snake-R simply has the best handling prowess that we've ever offered in the history of the car," said Vince LaViolette, Shelby American Vice President of Operations and Senior Designer. "From the fully adjustable coil overs to replacing rubber bushings with

metal spherical bearings and a harness strut bar that ties together the rear shock towers, this advanced suspension is very impressive. We tuck everything underneath a gorgeous wide body package that allows us to fit massive tires on the car to maximize traction."

He added, "We were obsessive in our efforts to reduce weight and improve the car's balance. From our proprietary hood to the splitter and other key components, we used carbon fiber components to minimize weight and redirect the wind for better cooling. The power to weight ratio of the Shelby Super Snake-R is staggering."

The 2026 Shelby Super Snake-R

starts at \$224,995(US), including the price of the base Ford Mustang Dark Horse.

The Super Snake-R is Shelby's third vehicle based on the S650 Ford Mustang, joining the likes of the 2024 Shelby Super Snake.





Ford Performance Head Explains Why Automaker Goes Racing (Ford Authority)

Ford racing fans rally behind a clever acronym: First On Race Day. The Blue Oval's racing heritage spans short tracks and drag strips alike, and soon, it will take to the open wheel scene thanks to its new Formula One partnership with Red Bull Racing. Mark Rushbrook, head of Ford Performance, recently sat down to explain what motivates the automaker to hit the track every week.

Ford Performance competes in all manner of motorsport, and Rushbrook said that racing serves three purposes. First, of course, it's good for the brand.

"Take our entrance into F1," Rushbrook said. "Our collaboration with Oracle Red Bull Racing and Visa CashApp Racing Bulls from 2026 will showcase our leadership in technical innovation to an audience of over 1 billion F1 followers."

It's also good for business. Rushbrook touted the Ford Mustang Dark Horse R, which gives customers a relatively accessible springboard to help launch their own racing endeavours. After starting with the Dark Horse R, prospective racers can jump to the likes of the Mustang GT3 and Mustang GT4, both of which have been making waves in international sportscar racing.

Finally, Ford Performance racing helps the automaker gather data and information that can then be applied to its roadgoing line. For example, "ultra-tough" competition like the FIA World Endurance Championship and even the Baja 1000 help engineers innovate. After all, if vehicle tech can withstand the demanding conditions of motorsports, it can surely perform on the street, too.

"Whatever the theatre, we're there to show the world what Ford can do when there's a challenge to be tackled, and we're enormously proud of what we've achieved." Rushbrook said. "Yet, despite being so varied, our Ford Performance programs are chosen carefully. Strategy is at the heart of any successful racing campaign, and we're equally strategic about how and why we race."

In short, Ford Performance does race just for the sake of racing, but it's also a way for the automaker to prove itself in front of a global audience.



2025 Ford Mustang Challenge at Le Mans Kicks into High Gear on June 9th (Ford Authority)

The Blue Oval's Mustang Challenge puts race car drivers and automotive enthusiasts from all corners of motorsport behind the wheel of the Ford Mustang Dark Horse R. Ford has lofty goals for its single-make racing series, planning to take it global – and that will start this weekend at the inaugural Mustang Challenge Le Mans Invitational.

A massive car count will take the green flag at Le Mans this weekend. On-track action kicked off on June 9th and the final race is scheduled for June 14th, 2025, preceding the iconic 24 Hours of Le Mans set to start later that evening. Forty examples of the Mustang Dark Horse R will race in the Mustang Challenge at Circuit de la Sarthe, split among three divisions: Dark Horse, Dark Horse Legends, and Dark Horse Stars.

The Dark Horse Stars class is the star of the show, as its name implies. It's unique to the Le Mans Invitational race, featuring talent from other motorsports, veteran sportscar operators, and more. Notable entries in-

clude Sir Chris Hoy and Chris Harris, along with Ford Formula Drift drivers Chelsea DeNofa and Tanner Foust, the latter of which is a 10-times X-Games medalist, three-time Rally-Cross champion, and two-time Formula Drift champion.

"This opportunity is huge, and that's a big reason why I got involved in Mustang Challenge in the first place," said DeNofa. "You don't just become a race car driver and then shortly after, able to drive at Le Mans in a spec homologated chassis. Those are all words that are not really thrown around in motorsports nowadays."

Franke Muniz, who played the titular character on popular sitcom *Malcom In The Middle* before transitioning to motorsports, will drive a Dark Horse R this weekend. It'll be his first attempt on the storied asphalt at Le Mans. And never to be one left out of Blue Oval-powered action, Ford CEO Jim Farley will take up the reins of his own Mustang Challenge machine this weekend.






Ford Mustang Coupe's Future Will Remain Gasoline Powered (Ford Authority)

It was just a few years ago when a full transition to all-electric power seemed inevitable, but a lot has changed since then. Today. tomakers have scaled back electrification plans in a big way, all to adjust for weaker than expected demand for such vehicles. As for the iconic Ford Mustang, it has always seemed to be destined to hang on to traditional ICE powertrains longer than most vehicles - a notion supported by comments from Blue Oval CEO Jim Farley himself – and it seems like nothing has changed on that front, either.

According to *Automotive News*, the Ford Mustang won't be going allelectric anytime soon, as The Blue Oval will "be building gasoline pony cars well into the next decade." The report notes that the Mustang is slated to undergo a refresh in late 2026, followed by a redesign anticipated for 2029. Previously, FoMoCo was mulling the idea of transitioning to an EV-only pony car as part of that latter action, but now, that's

no longer the case.

What's particularly interesting this report is about the fact that back in May 2024, Farley said that "we will never make an allelectric Mustang. I look at other users of pure-electric power such as Formula E, and even companies like Rimac, and I just don't think that would be right for Mustang. Great for other Fords - look at the worldwide success of Transit – but not for Mustang." It is possible that the decision to nix an EV next-gen pony car was made prior to these comments, however.

Regardless, we do know that the Ford Mustang will be getting some sort of partial electrification, hybrid powertrain before 2030, based on the automaker's plans to add a hybrid option to every model in its Ford Blue lineup by 2030. We were previously promised a V8 hybrid-powered pony car way back in January 2017 for the 2020 model year, but that still hasn't come to fruition.


